

INTRODUCTION: Distinction between Private International Law and Public International Law



- Private International Law rules:
 - 1. A competent court
 - 2. The applicable law
 - 3. Whether recognition and enforcement are possible
- Public International Law also regulates relations between States and non-State actors.

INTRODUCTION: Traditional Theories on the Relationship between International and Domestic Law

International and Domestic law are unified law are separate bodies of law that exist independently of each other

Monism:

- Civil law countries are monistic.
- Such examples are Chile, Japan, Mexico, Peru and Viet Nam.

• Dualism:

- Common law countries are primarily dualist
- Such examples are Brunei, Australia, Canada, Malaysia, New Zealand, Singapore and USA.

World Trade Organization: Introduction

- Article 1 of the Marrakesh Agreement established the World Trade Organization (WTO) on 1st January 1995.
- Annexed to the Marrakesh Agreement are:
 - i. General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) 1994 (Annex 1A)
 - ii. General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS) (Annex 1B)
 - iii. Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) (Annex 1C)
 - iv. Understanding on Rules and Procedures governing the Settlement of Disputes (DSU) (Annex 2)
 - v. Trade Policy Review Mechanism (TPRM) (Annex 3)
 - vi. Plurilateral Trade Agreement (Annex 4)

TRIPS: Domestic Implementation

- Pre WTO, Brunei IP legislation were:
 - 1. Trade Marks Act (Cap 98)
 - 2. Merchandise Marks Act (Cap 96).
 - **3. Inventions Act** (Cap 72)
- After Brunei became a party to WTO and TRIPS on 1st January 1995, Brunei was obligated to introduce or amend IP legislation which are:
 - 1. Copyright: Copyright Order
 - 2. Industrial Design: Industrial Designs Order
 - 3. Layout Design: Layout Designs Order
 - 4. Patent: Patent Order
 - 5. Trademarks: Trademarks Act
- Established the Brunei Intellectual Property Office (BruIPO) on 1st June 2013.
- Became parties to several international IP Treaties such as the Berne Convention, Paris Convention, Budapest Treaty and the Hague Agreement.

TPRM: Introduction

- Purpose:
 - 1. Achieve greater **transparency** in the **trade policies and practices** of Members; and
 - 2. To contribute and to improved adherence by all Members to rules, disciplines and commitments made under the WTO agreements.

TPRM: Domestic Implementation

1st Review 2001

- Investment Incentives Order
- Revised BEDB Act
- Industrial Coordination Order
- IP laws were enacted
- BIFC established
- Corporatize JTB

2nd Review 2008

- Brunei's Constitution was revised
- MFA was renamed MoFAT
- Involved in FTA negotiations with China, Japan, Korea, India, Australia and New Zealand
- Liberalise some sectors
- DTA with several countries
- BEDB Act amended
- NSAC was formed
- AITI was established

3rd Review 2014

- Launched National Vision 2035
- Established AMBD
- Committed to new FTAs: AJCEP, AANZFTA, TPP, RCEP and AHKFTA
- Signed 16 ADTAs
- Signed 8 BITs
- ROCBN was moved to MoF
- Setting up BruIPO
- NSC was set up

Trans Pacific Partnership: Introduction

'High quality 21st Century' Agreement between Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, Singapore, USA and Viet Nam.

Grew out from the 'Pacific Four' (P4) Agreement [Brunei, Chile, Singapore & New Zealand].

Domestic Implementation: Sanitary and Phyto-sanitary

Amend/Implement Legislation

- Agricultural Pests and Noxious Plant Act
- Fishery Order
- Public Health (Food) Act and Regulation
- Wholesome Meat Order 2011
- Plant Quarantine Order
- Animal Infectious Disease and Quarantine Order

Transparency Obligation

- Notify proposed SPS that may affect trade of another Party
- Make available to the public:
 - Proposed SPS measure
 - Legal basis
 - Receiving written comments

Domestic Implementation: Intellectual Property

Treaties to Accede

- Madrid Protocol
- WIPO Copyright Treaty
- WIPO Performances and Phonograms Treaty
- **UPOV Convention**

Amend IP & IP-related Legislation

- TM Act: sound marks
- Data Protection for Agricultural Chemical Products
- Patent Order:
 - Data Protection for Pharmaceutical Products including biologics
- Patent linkage
- © Order:
 - Term of protection from 50 years to 70 years
 - ISP's safe harbour
- Ex-officio for goods in transit

Domestic Implementation: Labour

Adopt and Maintain Statutes, Regulations & Practices as stated in the ILO Declaration

- Freedom of Association & Effective Recognition of the right to **collective bargaining**
- Elimination of all forms of **forced/compulsory labour**
- **Abolition** of child labour & **Prohibition** on the worst forms of child labour
- Elimination of discrimination in respect of employment & occupation
- Acceptable work conditions with respect to minimum wages, hours of work, and occupational safety and health.



Amend/Implement Legislation

- Trade Union Act
- Employment Order
 - Hazardous list conditions within which children can work
- Trade Dispute Act
 - Right to strike
 - Collective Bargaining
- Minimum Wage (?)
- Discrimination in respect of employment

Domestic Implementation: Environment

Objective

- Promote mutually supportive trade & environment policies
- Promote high levels of environmental protection & effective enforcement of environmental laws
- Enhance Parties' capacities to address trade-related environmental issues, including through cooperation

Implement Legislation

- Biodiversity Order 2015 (draft)
- Environmental Protection and Management Order (draft)
- Hazardous Waste Control Order (draft)

Other Implementation

• Identification of changes required to existing procedures and practice
