As cybercrime increasingly affects our society, it was apt to make cybercrime the theme for the 11th China-ASEAN Prosecutors-General Conference. It is in our common interest to emulate and derive best practices from each other in our effort to constantly improve existing mechanisms. Faced with new challenges, we need to advocate and formulate new measures which are practical and efficient.

Having legislation alone is not enough. Awareness and outreach programs to the community are also essential in order to ensure that as far as possible, we protect ourselves from being victims of cybercrime. Emphasis must also be placed on the cooperation we extend to one another when dealing with borderless crimes through international cooperation as well as the constant need for our human resources to be trained to know the latest threats and how to respond to them

In this regard, I look forward to hearing from you, all my counterparts on how your jurisdictions deal with cybercrime in your own countries and so enable us to learn from each other. I hope that we will all have a positive and constructive conference.
