Appointment under section 2

The Director of Agriculture is appointed a licensing officer for the purposes of the Act. S.29/59

Rules under section 9

RUBBER DEALERS (LICENSED DEALERS AND FEES) RULES S.30/59
S.309/65

1. These Rules may be cited as the Rubber Dealers (Licensed Dealers and Fees) Rules. Citation

2. In these Rules —

Inter-
pretation

“Act” means the Rubber Dealers Act;

“certificate” means the certificate of cultivation issued in accordance with section 7 of the Act.

PART I**LICENSED DEALERS**

3. The books of account kept by licensed dealers, as prescribed by section 5 of the Act, shall be written in Malay or English. Books of account

4. No licensed dealer shall purchase any rubber unless there is produced at the time of purchase the certificate relating to the land from which has been produced the rubber offered for sale. Production of certificate of cultivation

5. A licensed dealer shall satisfy himself, from inspection of the certificate, that the rubber offered for sale may reasonably be supposed to have been produced on the land to which the certificate relates. Duty to be satisfied as to rubber offered for sale

6. At the time of purchase of any rubber, the licensed dealer shall see that there are endorsed on the certificate the following particulars — Endorsement of certificate of cultivation

(a) date of purchase of the rubber;

(b) its weight and description;

(c) its price; and

(d) the signature or “chop” of the licensed dealer.

Production of certificate of cultivation

7. Persons to whom certificates are issued shall —

(a) carefully preserve them, and

(b) where called upon to do so by the licensing officer, shall produce them to him for his inspection.

Duplicate certificate

8. (1) Subject to paragraph (2), where a certificate is lost, the licensing officer may, on payment of a fee of \$25, issue a duplicate of it.

(2) The Minister may, in his discretion, reduce the amount of that fee.

PART II

FEES

Fees for licences

9. The fees for licences issued under the Act are as set out in the Schedule.

Deposit as security

10. A licensed dealer shall deposit, in the Government Treasury, the sum of \$200 to serve as security for his proper observance of the terms of his licence.

SCHEDULE

(Rule 9)

I. Licence to purchase (including the right to store in the premises licensed) \$100 per annum

II. Licences to treat or store or both, where the rubber treated or stored is wholly or partly not grown or produced on land in occupation of licensee —

(a) Licence to store (in respect of a place for storage only and not for the treatment of rubber) \$ 40 per annum

(b) Licence to treat and store —

(i) in respect of a power-driven factory \$ 40 per annum

(ii) in respect of a smoke-house and treatment with hand-rolling machines \$ 8 per annum

III. Licence to treat or store or both, where the rubber to be treated or stored is wholly grown or produced on land in occupation of licensee \$ 1 per annum
