

No. S 43—THE CUSTOMS ENACTMENT, 1954.

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 134 of the Customs Enactment, 1954, the Resident has made the following regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Customs (Government Wharf Dues) Regulations, 1957, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1957. Citation and commencement

2. In these regulations—

“Customs Wharf” means the Government Wharf provided for the landing and loading of cargo at each of the places specified in the First Schedule. Interpretation

3. Wharf Dues shall be paid on all goods landed or loaded at a Customs Wharf at the rates specified in the Second Schedule : Wharf Dues.

Provided that where cargo is transhipped and passed over and not placed on the wharf at the place of transhipment, only half such rates will be charged.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Brunei Town

SECOND SCHEDULE

On every package not exceeding 50 katties	- .04 cents
On every package over 50 katties but not exceeding two pikuls	- - - - .06 cents
On every package exceeding two pikuls for each pikul or part thereof	- - - - .03 cents
On timber per 10 cu. ft. or part thereof	- .06 cents
On livestock: cattle, horses each	- - - - .30 cents
pigs, sheep, goats each	- - - - .16 cents
Poultry each	- - - - .02 cents
On loose cargo such as bricks, gravel, granite, firewood or any cargo of a like nature for each pikul or part thereof	- - .03 cents

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations govern the charges for wharf dues in the State of Brunei. The rates have been increased, but it is the first increase of rates since 1947. The extra revenue will be used to provide for the purchase and maintenance of cargo handling equipment for use by importers to facilitate the rapid clearance of cargo.
