## THE BRUNEI MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL

S.27/54 S.71/75

By the Grace of God, We, Omar Ali Saifuddin Wasa'dul Khairi Waddin, ibni Almarhum Sultan Sir Mohamed Jemal-ul Alam, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of the State and Territory of Brunei and all its Dependencies, Honorary Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George,

WHEREAS We are desirous of instituting a Medal as a reward for meritorious service to Brunei.

NOW, THEREFORE, according to Our Will and Pleasure, We do by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, institute, constitute and create a new Medal, and We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances for the governance of the said Medal.

1. The Medal shall be designated and styled "The Brunei Meritorious Service Medal".

The Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of sterling silver having, on the obverse, a kris and an ear of padi in bas-relief encircled by the name of the Medal in Roman Script (MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL BRUNEI) and on the reverse a design of the State Crest in bas-relief encircled in the lower half by the wording in Jawi Script.
- 3. The Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended through a ring by a ribbon one inch and one quarter wide of a design according to the class of Medal. The ribbon to be large yellow in the middle with white, green, red and black stripes each one sixteenth inch wide on either side.
- 4. The Medal may be awarded to any person who has performed service of conspicuous merit to Brunei, such service being characterised by resource and devotion to duty, including prolonged service marked by exceptional ability, merit and exemplary conduct.

- The names of the persons to whom this Medal is awarded shall be published in the Brunei Government Gazette and a register of such names shall be kept in the Lapau, Brunei.
- 6. Any person who has been or may hereafter be awarded this Medal may, on all occasions when the use of such is customary, place after his or her name the letters PJK.
