ROAD TRAFFIC (SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL) REGULATIONS

Commencement: 8th March 2006

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (School Crossing Patrol) Regulations.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires —

“prescribed sign” means the sign referred to in regulation 9;

“school crossing” means any part of a road within the vicinity of a school where a person is crossing or seeking to cross it on his way to or from school;

“school crossing patrol” means any person appointed as such under regulation 4.

Arrangements for patrolling school crossings

3. Arrangements may be made by the Director for the patrolling of school crossings during the period between 6:30 in the morning and 6:30 in the evening by school crossing patrols.

School crossing patrols

4. The Director may appoint such number of persons to be school crossing patrols for the purpose of these Regulations.

Delegation

5. (1) The Director may delegate his duties with respect to the organisation and administration of the school crossing patrol to any person who, or any authority which, shall be under the control and direction of the Director.

(2) Any person or authority so delegated shall exercise such duties.

Duty with respect to qualification and training of school crossing patrol

6. The function of the Director for the purposes of making any arrangement under regulation 3 shall include the duty to satisfy himself of the qualifications of, and to provide the requisite training of, persons to be a school crossing patrol.

[Subsidiary]

Power to stop traffic

7. When a vehicle is approaching a school crossing, a school crossing patrol wearing a uniform approved by the Director shall have power to require the person driving, propelling or riding the vehicle to stop it, by exhibiting the prescribed sign in such manner as the Director may require.

Drivers of vehicle to stop at school crossing

8. Any person to whom a prescribed sign is exhibited pursuant to regulation 7 —

(a) shall cause the vehicle to stop before reaching the school crossing, so as not to stop or impede any person crossing; and

(b) shall not put the vehicle in motion so long as the prescribed sign continues to be exhibited by the school crossing patrol.

Prescribed sign

9. For the purposes of these Regulations, a sign exhibited by a school crossing patrol shall be of the size, colour and type as prescribed in the Schedule and shall contain the words “STOP” or “BERHENTI” with the letters painted in black on a white luminous background and a red border around the sign.

Presumptions

10. For the purposes of these Regulations, unless the contrary is shown —

(a) a sign exhibited by a school crossing patrol shall be presumed to be of the size, colour and type prescribed under these Regulations and to have been exhibited in the required manner;

(b) the uniform of a school crossing patrol shall be presumed to be a uniform approved by the Director.

Penalty

11. Any person who fails to comply with or contravenes regulation 8 is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 and, in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding \$2,000.
